The purpose of an Eagle Scout project is to provide a Scout with the opportunity to demonstrate leadership and community service by designing, planning and carrying out a service project that benefits our community and the public. The Eagle Scout candidate is the project leader and leads others Scouts and friends to complete the project. Here are some examples of projects completed by Eagle Scouts of Troop 677:

Layout and paint a 50 foot by 50 foot map of the United States with different colors for each state on the asphalt playground of the Ellisville Elementary School (Renny Esser, 2003)

Build steps on a steep part of the Rockwood Trail in West St. Louis County (J.P. Bornholdt, 2002)

Install rock walkways, landscaping, and correct drainage problems at the Pond Athletic Field. (Alex Gavenda, 2002).

Build and install six park benches at the Gazebo in the Creve Coeur Park (Luke Sapp, 2001).

Catalogue 2000 books and create a library reference and check out system for the Early Childhood Center at the Ellisville Methodist Church (Andy Ritts, 2001).

Build and install a pavilion for the Wabash, Frisco, and Pacific Railroad park in Glencoe. (Brian Klesh, 2001)

Build three shelving units for the storage of toys at the nursery at the Ellisville United Methodist Church (John Krebsbach, 2001).

Design and build an interactive water display using plastic pipes and pumps for the Early Childhood Development Center at the Ellisville Methodist Church (Derek Goltz, 2001).

Establish an annual linen drive for the needy to be conducted by a Pack. Build two 4' X 4' movable boxes to collect the linens. (Michael Curtis, 2001).

Design and build two movable storage bookcases for the Early Childhood Development Center at the Ellisville Methodist Church (John Weeks, 2001).

Build wolf dens for the Wolf Sanctuary (located near Beaumont). (Ryan Bichtemann, 2001 and Doug Bingham, 1996).

Design and construct movable storage units for band uniforms at Lafayette High School (Brad Hugill, 1998).

Design and build a wall hanging unit to store and display church brochures for the Ellisville United Methodist Church (Steve Bingham, 1996)

Conduct a thorough safety inspection of the Ellisville Methodist Church, install safety exit signs in every room in the Church, and conduct fire safety training for groups using the Church (Justin Hesterlee, 1998).

Design and build a computer desk for the Ascension Catholic Church (Matt Dickey, 1997).

Build two uniform closets for the Lafayette High school Orchestra (Brian Magee, 1997).

Build horseshoe courts for the Ellisville Athletic Fields (Richard Bray, 1996).

Design and build shelves and hanging racks for the Lord of Life Lutheran Church (Ryan Flesner, 1997).

Improve the safety, design, and appearance (including new landscaping) of the western edge of the property of the Ellisville United Methodist Church. (Ned Talbot, 1996).

Build two tables for the Wolf Sanctuary (Joe Niedringhaus, 1997).

Build two large shelves for the Rockwood Pre-School at Lafayette High School (Josh Bingaman, 1997).

Build a large shelf system for the utility room at the Ellisville United Methodist Church (Alex Dzatko, 1997).

Design and construct four display boards to hold flyers for the Lord of Life Lutheran Church (Matt McCormick, 1994).

Design and construct three large bins for mission donations by church members to include food, clothing, and toys. (Mark Doescher, 1993)

Design and build a wall partition with a door in a building for the Wolf Sanctuary (Beau Grabner, 1993).

Construct and build a fence to serve as a safety and appearance screen around three large commercial air conditioners at the St. Marks Presbyterian Church (Brian Grothe, 1994).

Establish a data base to assist the Mid-America Transplant Organization, a clearing house for human organ donors (Doug Irwin, 1994).

Install new sports equipment including basketball net and stand and horseshoe pits for the Ellisville United Methodist Church (Greg Magee, 1992).
