

**Eagle Scout Kevin Rehn**  
**To serve on His Fifth Staff Assignment at JLTC**

Eagle Scout Kevin Rehn will be serving on the staff of Junior Leader Training Camp (JLTC) this summer at the S-F Ranch. This will be Kevin's fifth staff assignment, the most any Scout from Troop 677 has ever served.

Kevin has served on JLTC staffs as a Troop Guide two times, Assistant Senior Patrol Leader once, and once as a Senior Patrol Leader.

In 2002, he attended the National Junior Leader Instruction Camp at Philmont. This was a week long training course focused on improving presentation skills. The Greater St. Louis Area Council recommended Kevin attend this national training camp based on his leadership skills exhibited in JLTC. The course is designed to help youth leaders in JLTC be more effective in their presentations. Kevin has also found that what he learned has helped him in his leadership roles at Lafayette High School where he is a junior, active in the Key Club, the drum line of the marching band, and the math honor society Mu Alpha Theta.

Kevin is active in the Shawnee Lodge of the Order of the Arrow and serves in the New Horizons District Chapter as the western area Troop Representative Chair. He is responsible for promoting the Order of the Arrow and its activities with 20 troops.

When asked what JLTC staff assignments have taught Kevin he said "JLTC has taught me how to use effective leadership skills. It gave me a chance to my leadership skills into practice with large groups of Scouts. I know that I will use these leadership skills for the rest of my life. I have sought out these five staff assignments because I learn more about leadership when I have to teach it."

Kevin adds that "The JLTC course is a lot of fun and yet has some work to it. What you put into the course is what you will take back from it. Scouts who enjoyed JLTC went there with an open mind to learn to be better leaders. It's an opportunity to meet new friends."

Kevin encourages all the current Troop Guides and Scouts in leadership positions (Patrol Leader, ASPL, SPL) to attend JLTC and learn as much as he has.

Kevin's father, Mike Rehn, is the past Advancement Chairman and still active as an adult leader in the Troop. He is Wood Badge trained.

Kevin earned his Eagle from Troop 677 on April 12, 2000 – our 75<sup>th</sup> Eagle Scout.

Kevin is an outstanding example of how an Eagle Scout is giving something back to Scouting beyond the date he earned his Eagle.
