Friday February 17th

Bus arrives at Chesterfield Elementary at 7:30 pm

Check forms, load bus and get organized

Departure from Chesterfield Elementary at 8:00 pm

We will stop once on the way up to Wausau (probably between 10 pm and midnight)

Saturday February 18th

If the roads are good we should arrive at Camp Sturtevant by 4:30 am

Unload the bus and grab a little sleep

Breakfast at the sleeping lodge 7 to 7:30 (cold breakfast)

Departure for Granite Peak 8 am

Arrival at Granite Peak for check in and equipment rental 8:30 am

Lifts open 9 am

New this year - one free one hour ski school lesson as a group for those interested

Lunch in lodge 11:30 to 12:30 as people take breaks (cold cuts)

At a time to be determined, scouts will be able to demonstrate and complete the skills requirement for the Snow Sports merit badge on either Saturday or Sunday.

Bus departs Granite Peak for Camp Sturtevant at 4:30 pm

Arrival at Camp Sturtevant 5 pm

Change from ski gear to swim gear and depart for Cedar Lodge by 5:30 pm

Arrival at Cedar Lodge and check in by 6 pm

Pizza served at Grand Lodge between 6:30 – 7:30 pm

Departure from Grand Lodge at 9 pm

Arrival at Camp Sturtevant at 9:30 pm

Lights out at 10:30 pm in lodge

Sunday February 19th

Breakfast at the sleeping lodge from 7 to 7:30 am (cold breakfast)

Load bus and clean up lodge 8 am

Depart for Granite Peak 8:30 am

Arrival at Granite Peak 9:00 am

What to Bring

- Plenty of ski clothes as it can be cold and windy and you don't want to get cold (it was 13 below five years ago on Saturday morning)
- Extra socks as you will always want to have a dry pair when skiing
- Those cheap disposable hand and feet warmers (they can really make a difference)
- Sleeping bag and pillow - the lodge has bunk beds and two separate wings (one for snorers and the other for non-snorers – yea right)
- PJs for the lodge as we are Co-ed on this trip
- Swimming suits and towels for the Grand Lodge water park
- Quarters for lockers at Grand Lodge
- Toiletries and a towel for showering
- Something to read or watch on the bus
- The bus has both a DVD and VHS player so bring your movies. However we will only show age appropriate movies (PG-13, PG and G movies only and I reserve the right to not show some PG-13 movies)
- The bus also has a CD player so bring CDs as well – again I reserve the right to control what music is played
- Money for snacks at bus stops up and back and at Granite Peak Ski Resort & Grand Lodge Water Park for snacks and souvenirs
